MR. ACHORN'S NEW CANE

The Board of Selectmen called at the home of Mr. Henry E. Achorn, Union street, East Walpole, Wednesday, September 29th.

Mr. Achorn being the oldest citizen in town, was presented the Boston Post cane. He will be eighty-seven years old next November, has served three years and six months in the Civil war and is a charter member of the E. B. Piper Post, No. 157, G. A. R. Mr. Achorn was very much pleased to receive the cane and made an appropriate response to the presentation speech by chairman Delaney.

The cane was made for this purpose by J. F. Bradley & Co. New York. It is of carefully selected gaboon ivory from the Congo, Africa. The head is of rolled gold of 14 carat fineness. The idea is that the cane shall always be owned and carried by the oldest citizen of the town. It shall be duly transmitted to the then oldest citizen, always remaining in the possession of the oldest citizen of the town.

Mr. Henry G. Scherer, of Main street, north end of town, the former possessor died last April, aged 93 years 5 months, 9 days.
